To explore the **northwest**, begin at **Route 1**.

- Proceed west on Interstate 494
- Follow Interstate 94 west
- Head east on Highway 24 (Exit 178)
- Then proceed west on US Highway 10

EXPLORE LITTLE FALLS:

The Charles Lindbergh House and Museum

Tour the boyhood home of Charles Lindbergh, explore the visitor center exhibits, including a "Spirit of St. Louis" flight simulator, and walk an interpretive trail along the river. Additional trails are located in the adjacent Charles A. Lindbergh State Park. The Charles A. Lindbergh Historic Site is a National Historic Landmark.

Walk along the historic Red River Ox Cart Trail past the historic Beaulieu House and the other remains of the once prosperous town of Old Crow Wing. Enjoy the natural beauty of this site at the confluence of the Crow Wing and the Mississippi Rivers.

EXPLORE NISSWA, PEQUOT LAKES, PINE RIVER AND WALKER TO EXPLORE UNIQUE SHOPS AND LOCAL RESTAURANTS IN THESE CHARMING SMALL TOWNS.

- Continue north on Highway 371
- Go east on US Highway 2
- Then proceed north on Highway 39, also known as the Lady Slipper Scenic Byway
- Continue north on Highway 72
- Proceed east on Highway 1
- Then head north on Highway 72



EXPLORE BIG BOG STATE RECREATION AREA:

Big Bog State Recreation Area

- From St. Cloud, proceed west on Interstate 94
- Then head north on Highway 71 (Exit 127)

EXPLORE THE HEADWATERS OF THE MISSISSIPPI AT ITASCA STATE PARK:

Established in 1891, Itasca is Minnesota's oldest State Park. In this 32,000 acre sanctuary, the mighty Mississippi River begins its 2,552 mile journey to the Gulf of Mexico. Points of interest include old growth pine at Preacher's Grove, Peace Pipe Vista, bison kill site and over 100 lakes.

From the east entrance of the park, follow Highway 71 north to Bemidji

Called Minnesota's last true wilderness. The 500 square mile peat bog is the largest in the lower 48 states. A mile-long boardwalk enables visitors to get a first-hand look at the unique plant and animal life.

Continue north on Highway 72 to Lake of the Woods

ROUTE 2: EXPLORE NORTHEAST MN. MSP TO ST PAUL, DULUTH AND GRAND RAPIDS OR THE IRON RANGE AND INTERNATIONAL FALLS.

- Go east on MN Highway 5 from Glumack Dr (MSP airport)
- Proceed north on Interstate 35 E

EXPLORE ST. PAUL:

This National Historic Landmark resides on Dakota homeland at the confluence of the Mississippi and Minnesota rivers. Explore the voices and stories of the men, women, and children who crossed paths here over the centuries - from the Dakota, Ojibwe, and enslaved people, to immigrants, soldiers, and fur traders.

Explore upstairs and downstairs life in Minnesota's Downton Abbey, a 36,000-square-foot mansion built for railroad titan James J. Hill. The rugged stone, massive scale, fine detail, and ingenious mechanical systems of this magnificent Gilded Age mansion recall the powerful presence of James J. Hill, builder of the Great Northern Railway. With 13 bathrooms, 22 fireplaces, 16 chandeliers, a reception hall nearly 100 feet long, sophisticated technical systems, and a two-story, skylit art gallery, this mansion was once the largest private residence in the state.

This restored St. Paul and Duluth Railroad Depot contains artifacts and stories from the great Hinckley fire of 1894, a firestorm that devastated six towns in east central Minnesota. This was one of the biggest natural disasters in Minnesota history.

- Head south on US Highway 71
- Proceed west on MN Highway 1
- Then go north on MN Highway 72

The United States Hockey Hall of Fame Museum is America's hockey showcase. Experience the thrilling game action and inspiring achievements via physical displays, exhibits, video, theater and memorabilia.

Located in beautiful Olcott Park, the museum complex consists of the former park superintendent's residence, a Finnish log house and a 1930s tourist cabin. Permanent exhibits depict logging and lumbering industries and Virginia's fires of 1893 and 1900.



Greyhound Bus Museum

Featuring 18 historical buses and a 1914 Hupmobile, AV exhibits, hundreds of artifacts and memorabilia, diorama of a 1916 bus being built, and outside exhibits of 1940 Art Deco Terminal and 1921 Flag Stop Station.

The museum features an outdoor mining "truck park", huge mining shovels, a 1907 steam locomotive, ore cars, cabooses, and other mining heavy equipment. Inside the display buildings are a recreated mining town with offices, shops, and immigrant memorabilia, an authentic Finnish sauna, an extensive rock and mineral collection, and the simulated underground mine is a must-see. The museum also boasts the first Greyhound bus (made of wood!) as well as a vintage fire truck.

Minnesota Discovery Center's permanent exhibits feature displays on many Iron Range topics, including immigration, underground and open pit mining, the taconite process, logging, transportation, schools and saloons, and geology.

EXPLORE INTERNATIONAL FALLS:

A water-based park for recreation and experiencing the natural and cultural history of the Ojibwe, voyageur canoe-men, and viewing the spectacular scenery of the North Woods and Precambrian rock. With over 40% of the park water, Voyageurs is a maze of interconnected water highways. Plan ahead before coming to this water park by bringing your own watercraft, reserving a watercraft, or reserving a park ranger boat tour.

The Museum Galleries document the northern Minnesota region, including Native history and culture, European settlement, and the exploitation of natural resources through the fur trade to modern forestry. There is also a horse-drawn Steam Fire Engine and an annex dedicated to favorite son and charter NFL hall of famer Bronko Nagurski.

- Proceed south on US Highway 71
- Head West on Minnesota Highway 11
- Arrive at Lake of the Woods
